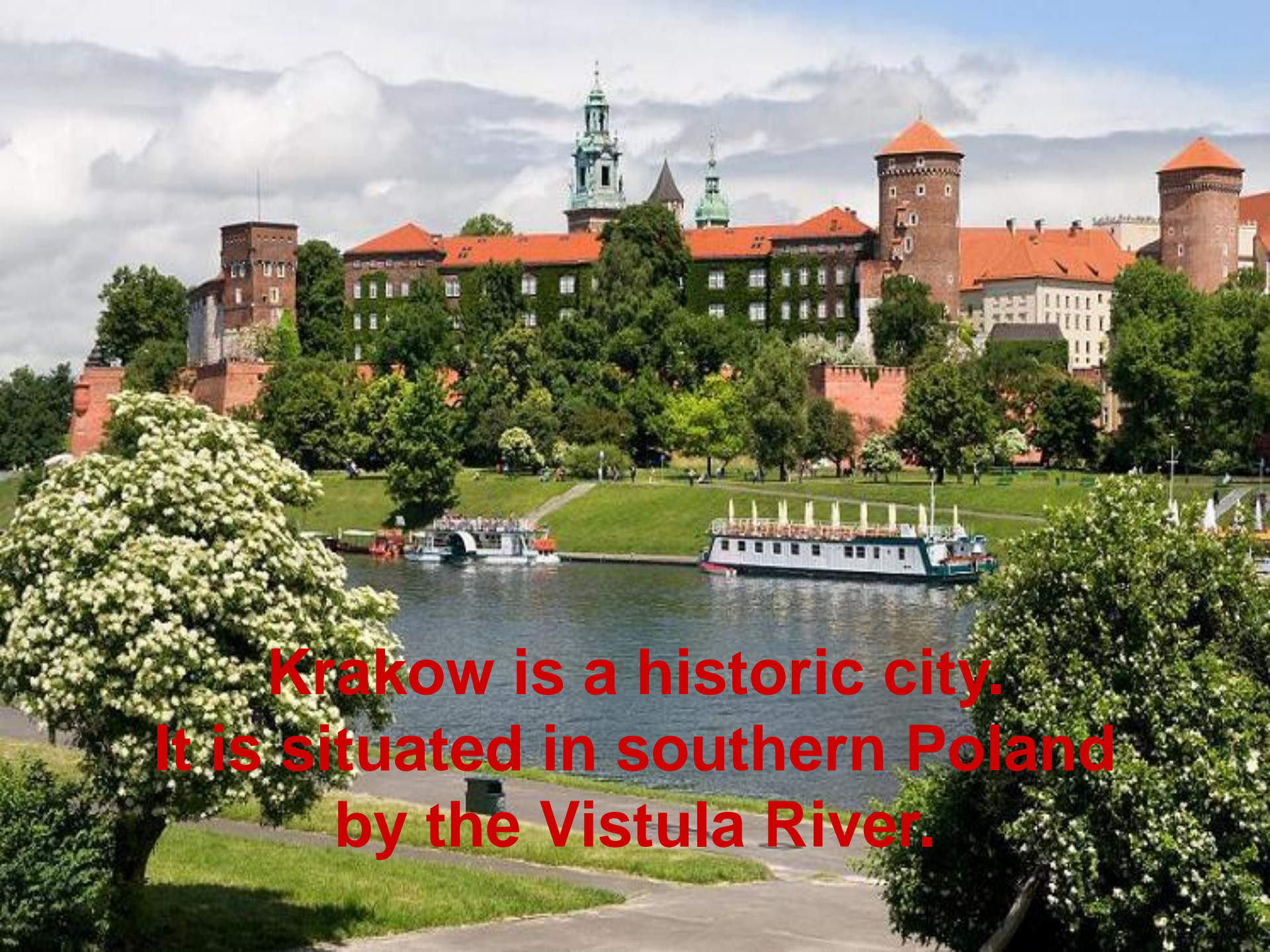


# WALK IN KRAKOW





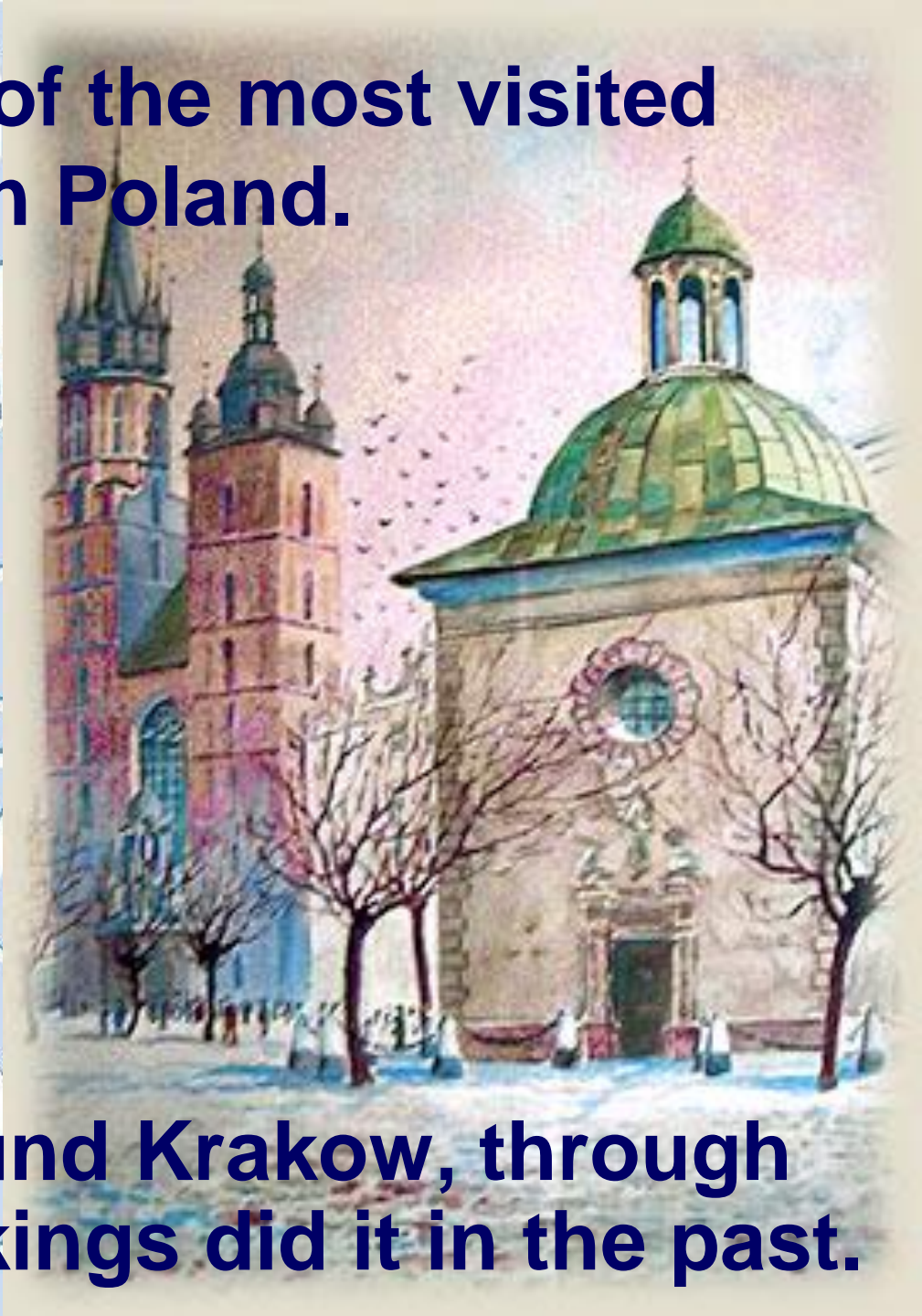
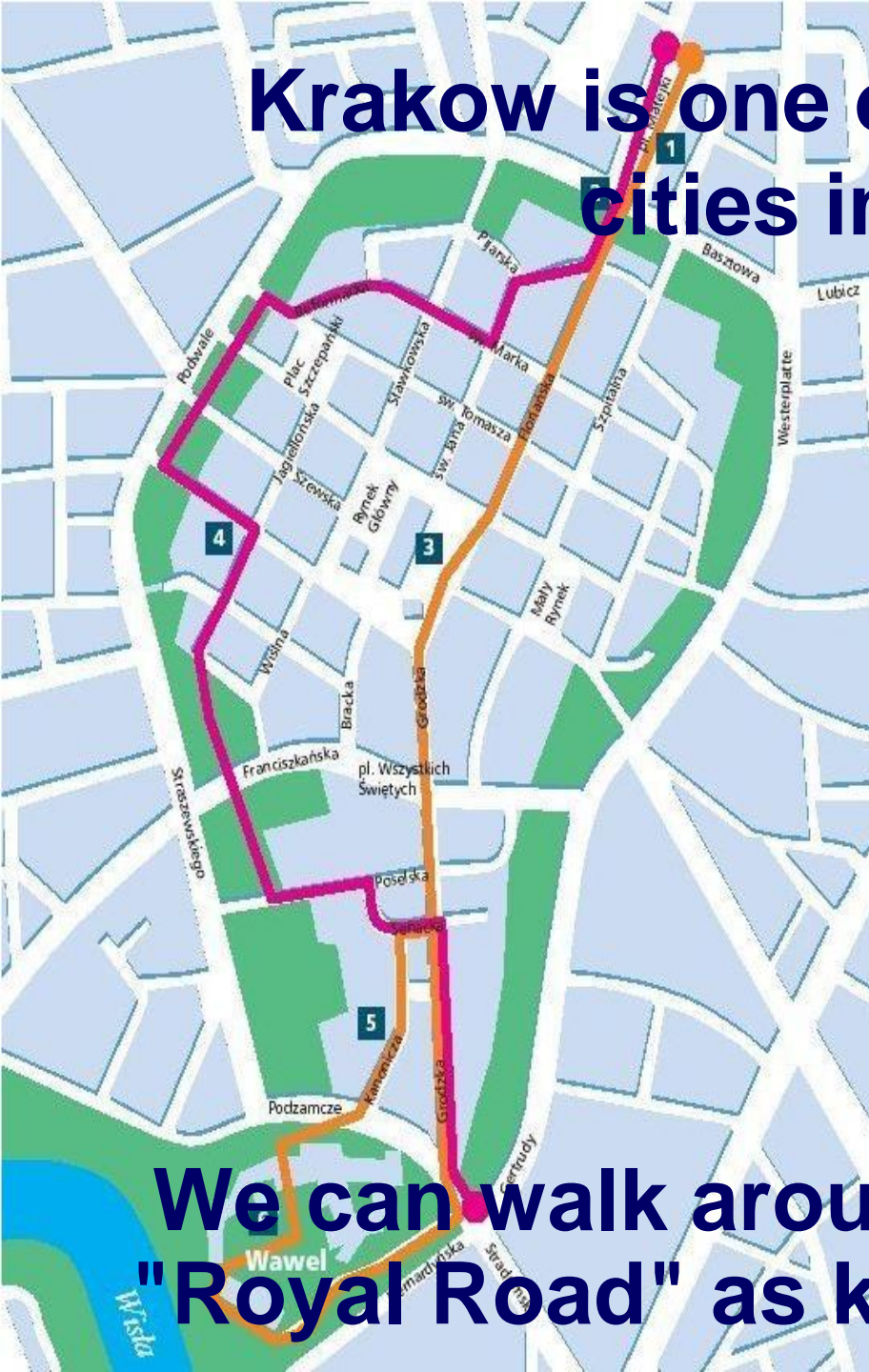
**Krakow is a historic city.

Cloth Hall.**


**Feeding pigeons is
